
#### Cantata Academy Invites You to the Chorale, All is Bright

Good Morning, Good Afternoon, Good Evening.

I am writing to you as the Moderator of the Presbytery of Detroit to share my thoughts and encouragement to persevere in the midst of trials, and to invite you to a Blue Christmas Service.

There's a lot going on in the world: A war between Ukraine and Russia and an ever-growing war between Israel and Hamas/Gaza, to name just two. Fighting between our political parties. Suicide rates going up. (I know of four individuals just in the last two months that are gone too soon.) Conflict within our own congregations, churches, and presbytery.

With all that is going on in the world, we need to return to our identity as Christians—our trust in Christ Jesus.

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. (John 11:25-26 NIV)

Christ has called us to be people of love, honor, peace, and grace. Yet we his people have not been loving, honoring, peaceful, or graceful. We have been lacking on many levels. We may be tired, exhausted, or even hurt, but we are called to gather at the table and work on narrowing the divide. For Jesus has promised that he is with us when even two or three are gathered in his name.

We as Christians and as Presbyterians of the Presbytery of Detroit are known for our love. Plain and simple. Love. And we are invited to hold out the light, not hide it under a bushel. For as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., said, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness. Only light can do that."

Christ is the light we need to see in this world. Let us reach out and be that light.

As we enter this Advent season, we are waiting, waiting for the baby to be born, waiting for peace, waiting for hope, and waiting for love. Sometimes we feel blue at this time of year. The days are shorter, and the darkness seems longer. We invite you to join us for a Blue Christmas Worship, where together we will light candles to help drive out the darkness.
