A native of Southeast Michigan, Jono Taccolini completed a Masters in Voice Performance degree at the University of Michigan School of Music Theater and Dance (SMTD) in 2022. He previously appeared in SMTD's production of Rise for Freedom (Sroufe), Cendrillon (Le Doyen de la Faculté), and Die Fledermaus (Dr. Blind). He graduated from Grand Valley State University (GVSU) in 2016 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music with Vocal Performance Honors. He appeared in numerous GVSU Opera Theater productions including Urinetown (Hotblades Harry), Company (Paul), Godspell (Disciple), Gianni Schicchi (Pinellino), and returned as a guest artist in the 2017 production of Sweeney Todd (Anthony). Jono has sung with the Opera Grand Rapids Chorus, Detroit Symphony Orchestra Chorus and has appeared as a soloist throughout the state including performing the Beethoven Mass in C with Hope College, the Bach cantata Gottes Zeit ist die Allerbeste Zeit with Concordia University, in Handel's Messiah with the Detroit Community Chorus. Most at home in the choir loft singing sacred music, Jono sings at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit specializing in sacred polyphony and Gregorian chant and has directed

and sung in chant scholas around the state and abroad. At GVSU, Jono was a recipient of the Laker Scholarship and the Leslie Eitzen Voice Scholarship and at SMTD he was the recipient of the Leslie Greer Voice Scholarship.
